Ecoepicenter is a part of the Department of Conservation of Genetic Resources of Armenian Flora, Institute of Botany after A. Takhtajyan, National Academy of Sciences of Armenia The living collection of Armenian flora is represented here in model biotopes, which are created similar to the main habitat types of Armenia. The collection of plants is formed with hundreds of species, including rare and endemic ones and it is open to public.

The inhabitants of the Alpine Corner what are they?

• They are beautiful herbaceous plants and small shrubs of the Armenian flora some of which are threatened and endemic species

• They are hardy, which means that they can survive a temperature of -15°C and lower and grow in conditions of wide temperature fluctuations.

Walk behind the stones to see the plants of alpine and subalpine belt.

The inhabitants of the Alpine Corner what are they?

• Some of them are very sensitive and fragile and are found only in the alpine belt – from around 2700 m above sea level and higher both in meadows and screes. So the creation of suitable conditions in the Alpine Corner was quite a challenge.

• Other plants prefer lower elevations and they often grow on rocks, stony slopes and screes. They too, require special care to grow, bloom and reproduce in the Alpine Corner.
